Feline

Distemper – A virus that causes vomiting and diarrhea, weight loss, dehydration, and decreased appetite.

Rhinotracheitis > All 3 are viruses that affect the respiratory tract. May cause

Calicivirus > coughing, sneezing, runny eyes and nose, and even ulcers in the

Pneumonitis > mouth area.

FelV (Feline Leukemia) – A virus similar to human HIV. It is highly contagious, is 85% fatal, and there is no cure.

*Females are ready to be spayed between 4 and 6 months of age. Males are ready to be neutered between 6 and 10 months of age. A 20% discount will be applied towards the cost of surgery if the client has their animal on heartworm preventative, and follows the vaccination schedule according to our recommendations.

All cats with no history of vaccinations must be boosted for FDRCP and FelV a minimum of 2 times at 3 week intervals, no matter what their age.
